



## Website Expanded Streaming Video A Success

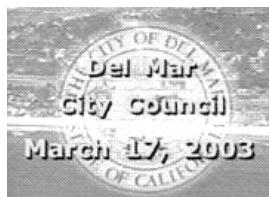
Our website has grown dramatically. Streaming Video has made our plan for world distribution of the DMTV programs via the internet a reality.

Five of our programs are now available through streaming video. You can see complete versions of all five programs by going to “[delmartv.com](http://delmartv.com)” and clicking on *video on demand*. Five more programs are slated for addition to those now available:



Riding Along with the Sheriff, Del Mar Library—Walk on the Wild Side, Powerhouse Park Concert—Del Mar All Stars/Eve Selis, Del Mar Life and Producers’ Showcase. Future Candidates will include Del Mar Pulse segments “Sand on the Beach”, and “Train Station Workshop”.

Our website has also grown dramatically in other ways, Along with the monthly channel 66 program schedule and the streaming video, you’ll find a program listing of when the DMTV programs are scheduled on Time Warner and Adelphia, a catalog listing of all the DMTV tapes that are at the Library (there’s 60), a Studio training class schedule, a description of the studio with a rate sheet for anyone who may want to rental it, the Del Mar Community Calendar and lots more. It’s worth checking out. Philippe Lamoise our Webmaster continues to do a great job of keeping our website up to date with new and interesting entries.



The Del Mar TV Foundation has just put a demonstration streaming video of the March 17th Del Mar City Council meeting. Just click on the City Council icon on the website. The video can be seen for the next 30 days.

The Del Mar TV Foundation is currently showing on DMTV channel 66, a Classic six part Oscar winning documentary series on why we entered WW II. The film was directed by Frank Capra. # PRESIDENT'S CUT

There certainly has been a change in what's on the tube since our last issue. Television in wartime does have the advantage of fewer commercials. I would like to make a comment on the war, not who's right or who's wrong, or why, or why not, but about the reality TV program that we now see 24 hours a day. I'm glad to see they have stopped showing most of the pictures through the night vision lens. If they continued that, people would get the impression the desert was green. I don't know about you, but it does seem to me that this war is not good live TV. Most of the airtime is filled with either pictures with nothing moving, talking heads, or just talking. There is some great footage being shot, but it's in need of a good editing job.

Well you won't see any pictures about the current war if you watch channel 66. The only war action you'll find is in some of our Classic Movies. We do have an Oscar winning documentary series about W.W.II produced by Frank Capra. It's about why we went to war in 1941. It's a six part series that is being rerun Friday nights at 10 p.m.. It really is worth watching.

Our own DMTF Productions continues to take on increased activity this year. We have a \$12,000 budget for the year. Already underway, we are working on the annual Lagoon Days, Live at the Belly Up with Prime Time and Jan Sutherland and, Payasada/HorsePlay Del Mar. Along with the City of Del Mar we co-sponsored "Trains off the Bluff", a video the showed the various options available for moving the tracks off the Del Mar bluff. Another big production carrying over from last year is the documentary on the building of the Library wall. We have some great footage that is now being edited. There's more to come, Summer Solstice, Summer at the Library, End of the Summer Picnic, Holiday in the Village and more musical programs.

We have a budget for all Grant programs for this year of \$20,600, over \$16,000 of that is for grants to individuals. Most of that has not yet been committed, so if you think you have a great idea for a show, submit a grant request. The form is available on the web and at the DMTV studio. We have some pretty experienced producers around that I'm sure would be happy to answer any questions you might have on what it takes to put on a production. Here's a short list of our star producers, all have produced seven or more programs in their series: Maria Gardiner and Luana Karr "Kidsnews", Philippe Lamoise "Rotary in Action", Joanne Price "Stairway to Fitness" and Ingrid Hoffmiester "Del Mar Life".

One our most successful new Grant programs continues to be the Producer's Showcase. For 2003 we have increased the budget and plan to support this group grant to the fullest. Steve Rose continues do a great job organizing the effort. The star "Showcase" producers are Eileen Sprague and Rosemary Vale, they have I think five or six Showcases to their credit. Keep up the good work Eileen and Rosemary.

The educational grant program is once again supported this year at the same level as we did last year. Paul Martin continues to do a great job in guiding his TPHS students in what fun it is to work in the TV media.

We have expanded the distribution of our programs outside the Del Mar cable network, to provide our programming to all of San Diego County. So if you live outside Del Mar, take a look at Time Warner (channel 19, Thursdays @ 7pm) and Adelpia (channel 3, Monday @ 8:30pm).

I hope you are as impressed as I am with the website progress we've made. I think Philippe is doing a great job as our Webmaster.

I want to welcome Connie Anderson as a new member of our Board. She brings a lot of communications skills to the Board and her background in fundraising will be a real asset to the TV Foundation. She has already produced a plan for a fundraising campaign. Thanks for accepting the challenge Connie.

I can't believe the Community Calendar went live a year ago. The Calendar can be seen at [www.delmartv.com/calendar](http://www.delmartv.com/calendar), on channel 66's daily bulletin board and as an insert to the Sandpiper Newsletter. We plan, with the Calendar Consortium, to expand the capabilities this year.
