They have also been recognized by the County Supervisors for their help in trying to get both people and animals out of the fire's jaws. # PRESIDENT'S CUT

Well Spring is upon us. This spring has some important significance for the Del Mar Television Foundation (DMTF). It was five years ago this spring that the Del Mar City Council approved the new DMTF bylaws that created the present self-governing DMTF organization. Prior to that, the Foundation was governed by a board appointed by the City Council. The board, at that time, did little more than administer the finances of the organization. There were almost no locally originated programs. I think there was only two. What a change from five years ago, you can all be proud.

When I thought about writing this article, I figured it would be easy to just recap what had transpired since the spring of 1999. It was not so easy. There were lots to write about, but where to start. I finally decided to start with what we didn't have at DMTV, compared to what we have now.

In the spring of '99, the City of Del Mar, had just installed over \$100,000 of new equipment but there were only two local programs being produced and lots of reruns of some good old programs...like KBCH, but there were no; Grant programs, Productions programs covering local events, Classic movies, Educational programs, Producer's Group, Producer's Showcase, Program distributed outside of the Del Mar cable, no Internet presents and just minimal training courses. Written communications like schedules, Newsletters and a database to collect the names of who to distribute all this to, were non-existent There wasn't anyway for the various volunteer organizations to communicate about their activities. And most of all, there was no activity by the DMTF board to raise funds to support the station.

So lets start at the beginning. The establishment of a Grant program was one on the very first things the all-new DMTF board did. Over the past five years, over \$60,000 has been set aside to provide funding for Grants to individuals. An addition \$20,000 in grant funding has been provided for Education and to the Producer's Group and it's Producer's Showcase. Providing training classes was another early on task. There are three different courses taught and since ATNB (After The New Bylaws) we have had from 12 to 15 classes a year. BTNB (Before) there were just 2 or 3 classes a year.

The Del Mar TV Foundation started to produce programs for DMTV66 at the beginning of it's second year. Since then over 50 programs have been produced. They have included historical events, informational programs, documentaries about the City departments, election forums and musical programs from places like; the Powerhouse, Powerhouse Park, the Stratford Café, the Del Mar Plaza and the L'Auberge hotel. The Producer's Group was establishment during the first year and it's had its ups and downs, but continues to provided a focal point and network for those interested in television production. One of the most successful Producer's Group activities has been the Producer's Showcase. Since the Showcase was initiated at the beginning of 2002, eighteen programs have been produced with over 25 people have participating as crewmembers and there have been a dozen different producers.

During our first year of operation I was able to obtain over 90 Classic movies for the Foundation's library. we have been showing these films three times a week on DMTV 66. There are enough movies in our library that we only repeat them for two weeks each year. I think that's a lot better then some of the commercial channels I watch.

One of our more important goals has been to "Build Our Community Through Communications". I think we have made great strides along those lines:

- Improving the communication programming on DMTV66 has always been job one
- Our website has been up for three years and had many improvements that provide viewers more information on what's happening on DMTV66. One of the important improvements we made was the addition of Streaming Videos of some of our programs.
- The website also now offers a complete monthly DMTV66 program schedule that is printable.
- The Community Calendar's was established almost three years ago to provide a way for the local organizations to communicate.
- We reached out to the rest of San Diego by expanding the distribution of our programs to Time Warner and Adelphia.

One of the first items on our first agenda was Fundraising, not an easy task. Monte Carlo Night at the Powerhouse was our first Fundraiser, ...we had three. There were a couple of Blues Nights and last October we had our first annual Fundraising drive. All in all, we have raised about \$90,000..... \$12,000 of that is being used to purchase new equipment for the studio.

On yes, along the way we won many national, regional and local awards for our productions.

You should all be proud of our accomplishments. There are LOTS of people to thank for the last five years of accomplishments. Way more than there is room for in this article.

So for now...That's a Wrap

Del Mar TV Foundation's newest foray into children's programming proves that educational videos can be fun....even history. "A Children's History of Del Mar is a 22 minute video created for local third graders. The video will be used as a teaching tool to supplement the children's local history curriculum. It will be premiering at the Powerhouse Community Center on Thursday, April 22nd at 7 p.m. and air the next day on DMTV Channel 66.

Co-Producer's Nicole Holliday and Tracy Phillips began the project in October of 2003 after being approached by Executive Producer Pete Glaser and local third grade teach, Janice Lee. "Our challenge was creating a video which was both historically accurate and interesting for 8 year olds." The Del Mar historical Society loaned over 150 photos for the production, which were brought to life with sound effects, some animation and the personality of five local third grade students who provided the narration.



Another upcoming show by Ingrid Hoffmeister is Get Smart about Art, Debi is also co-producing on this show. Later in the year Luana Karr will producing a showcase about a group of Doctors and Nurses who donate their time and expertise to help

children who are in need of plastic surgery, the non-profit organization is called Fresh Start.

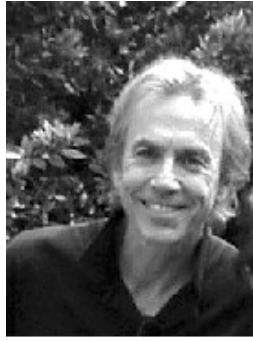
