For music buffs, who love concerts there's plenty of new stuff now showing on DMTV66. It started in May with a concert we taped of the Coastal Community Band. In July and August we taped two Powerhouse Park Twilight concerts; the "Corvettes" and "Savoir". All are being shown on DMTV 66. Check the schedule for time and day. In August we completed the final draft of our San Diego County grant project "Volunteers to the Rescue". Another production the TV Foundation got underway this summer was a program about the San Dieguito Boys and Girls Club's middle school athletic program. The 30 minute program will show "sports in action" using clips from five featured sporting events and on-camera interactions between the kids and famous local sports figures. Last November, we had our first "Del Mar TV Idol" contest as part of the Del Mar TV Foundation's annual Fundraising campaign. We are working on the 2nd annual "Del Mar TV Idol" contest. It will be held Sunday October 10th at the DMTV station. We will of course be taping it, so look for it on DMTV66.

There are two other important programs we have been working on this summer; the first "Del Mar History Week" in September and the "Del Mar City Council Candidate Forum" on October 7th. Check the schedule for the day and time when this will be seen.
